Week Ending January 31, 2025

Back to Work

After several days of budget hearings and meetings delayed or cancelled by snow and ice, the House and Senate returned to the State Capitol for legislative days six (Monday, January 27) through nine (Thursday, January 30). Most committees held "organizational" meetings where they adopted committee rules and introduced members to attendees.

Tort Reform

Governor Kemp unveiled comprehensive tort reform legislation (<u>SB 68</u> and <u>SB 69</u>) Thursday at a press conference that drew hundreds to the North Wing of the State Capitol. It was the largest crowd that we old timers could remember. The legislation is aimed at reining in huge jury verdicts Republicans say are making it hard for Georgia citizens and businesses to afford insurance premiums.

"Georgians should have every opportunity to pursue their constitutionally guaranteed day in court, and if were wronged, they should be made whole," Kemp said during the news conference. "But our businesses and hardworking Georgians need relief from the increased costs of doing business, having car insurance, and getting access to health care. I believe this package accomplishes those goals and strikes the right balance."

The tort reform legislation the governor is proposing is based on a report the state insurance department released last fall that showed the five-year average of claims has increased by 25%, much faster than Georgia's population growth. The number of large claim awards of more than a million dollars also has grown steadily.

Calvin Smyre Made History

Calvin Smyre made history as the longest-serving member of the Georgia House of Representatives. Lawmakers unveiled his official portrait Tuesday, the seventh of a Black person to be mounted on the walls of the Gold Dome. "I am grateful beyond words to see this happen in my lifetime," Smyre said. Smyre was 26 in 1974 when he was elected as a Democrat to the state House. He served 48 years until he stepped down in 2022 at age 74. He'd planned to serve 50 years, but President Joe Biden had nominated him as U.S. ambassador to the Dominican Republic. However, the U.S. Senate never confirmed his nomination.

The legislature will be in session Monday for Day 10 and remain in session through Thursday before taking Friday as a recess day. Committees will begin working full force by holding hearings, debating, amending and passing legislation.
