Tort Reform Moving On

Tort reform legislation, (SB 68 and SB 69), backed by Republican Gov. Brian Kemp and aimed at reining in huge jury awards supporters say cripple Georgia businesses, has cleared a state Senate committee following a five-hour hearing this past Monday night. The Senate Judiciary Committee voted 8-3 to advance the tort reform measure to the full Senate for consideration. Among other things, SB 68 would shield property owners from liability claims stemming from criminal acts committed by third parties outside of the owner's control, allow lawyers for defendants in suits stemming from car accidents to introduce evidence showing the injured party was not wearing a seatbelt, and require plaintiffs in liability cases to show the jury their actual medical costs when the jury is deliberating on compensation.

Speaker Names Interim Chief of Staff

Former Governor Nathan Deal's chief of staff, Chris Riley, will serve in that role in the House Speaker's office on an interim basis, announced Speaker Jon Burns. Riley will fill in for former state Rep. Terry England, who has served as Burns' chief of staff since 2023. England suffered a serious accident on his farm in Barrow County last weekend. Riley comes with a considerable amount of experience as he served as Deal's chief of staff during his entire tenure as governor. The Speaker told his House colleagues this week that England is getting better every day and will return to his post in the speaker's office after he recovers.

Next Week

The legislature will be in recess Monday for Presidents' Day and then convene on Tuesday for Day 18 and will remain in session through Friday, which will complete legislative day 21. The truck weight bill, <u>HB 164</u>, is on the House Transportation Committee meeting agenda to be heard next Thursday and the tort reform bills (<u>SB 68</u> and <u>SB 69</u>) may hit the Senate floor next week as well.

The Senate is expected to complete their review of the FY 25 amended budget as the House continues their work on the FY 26 budget.

<u>HB 36</u>, Guardians and Wards (Rep. Rob Leverett - R)

Relating to guardians and wards, so as to revise the list of providers who are authorized to participate in the process. **Status:** Referred to Judiciary Cmte, Passed Cmte, Pending Rules Cmte, Passed House, Sent to Senate

HB 238, Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council (Rep. Eddie Lumsden – R)

So as to require the Georgia Peace Officer Standards and Training Council to create and maintain an at-risk adult training course focusing on officer response to individuals with Alzheimer's disease or dementia. **Status:** Referred to Public Safety and Homeland Security Cmte

<u>HB 124</u>, Insurance for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders (Rep. Mitchell Scoggins – R) Relating to requiring coverage for healthcare services for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders such as streptococcal infection (PANDAS). **Status:** Referred to Insurance Cmte, Passed Cmte, Pending Rules Cmte

HB 173, Education; Department of; Adolescent Vaccinations Information (Rep. Darlene Taylor – R) So as to require the Department of Education to provide to parents and guardians of students entering the sixth grade information regarding recommended adolescent vaccinations in print or electronic form. **Status:** Referred to Education Cmte, withdrawn and recommitted to Public and Community Health Cmte, Passed Cmte by Substitute, Pending Rules Cmte

HB 322, Ga. Board of Dentistry (Rep. Lee Hawkins – R)

So as to revise provisions regarding the Georgia Board of Dentistry issuance of a dental or dental hygiene license for the sole purpose of teaching or instructing in an accredited dental school, dental hygiene school, or academic medical center in this state. **Status:** Referred to Health Cmte

HB 111, Personal state income tax rate reduction (Rep. Soo Hong – R)

Relating to the imposition, rate, computation, exemptions, and credits relative to income taxes, so as to reduce the rate of the personal state income tax; to provide for related matters. **Status:** Referred to Ways & Means Cmte, Passed Cmte, Pending Rules Cmte

HB 112, Income tax; One-time Tax Rebate (Rep. Lauren McDonald III – R)

So as to provide for a one-time tax credit for individual taxpayers who filed income tax returns for the 2023 and 2024 taxable years. **Status:** Referred to Ways & Means Cmte, Passed Cmte, Pending Rules Cmte

HB 282, Ad valorem tax; property; change certain definitions - (Rep. Vance Smith – R)

Relating to ad valorem taxation of property, so as to change certain definitions regarding such taxation. **Status:** Referred to Ways & Mean Cmte

<u>HB 365</u>, Strategic Industrial Development Enhancement (SIDE) Tax Credit Act; (Rep. Relating to dimensions and weight of vehicles and loads, so as to repeal automatic repeal provisions relating to an allowable variance for weight limitations upon a vehicle or load hauling certain commodities within a certain range and areas of the state; to provide for the enforcement of such provisions by local law enforcement officers; to provide for related matters. **Status:** Referred to Transportation Cmte
